From the academic session 2019-2020 'Choice Based Credit System' (CBCS) has been Introduced under Dibrugarh University

CBCS:

CBCS means 'Choice Based Credit System' which is a flexible system of learning. Herein 'credit' defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required. This system permits students to-

- ☐ Learn at their own pace
- ☐ Choose electives from a wide range of Elective courses offered for the programme
- ☐ Undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required number of credits
- ☐ Adopt an inter-disciplinary approach in learning
- ☐ Make the best use of the expertise of available faculty.

CREDIT: 'Credit' defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, normally in each of the course, credits will be assigned on the basis of the number of lectures/tutorials/laboratory work and other forms of learning required to complete the course contents in a 14-15 week schedule:



a.1 Lecture per week	= 1 Hour duration per week	= 1 Credit
b.1 Tutorial per week	= 1 Hour duration per week	= 1 Credit
C.1 Practical per week	= 2 Hours duration per week	= 1 Credit

1.Semester Duration:

- Odd Semester: June-November (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
 - Even Semester: December-May (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
- ☐ Any change in the Academic Calendar/Schedule may be made by the University whenever necessary.

2.Course Structure:

The nature of the Courses of all Under Graduate Academic Programmes under CBCS is given below:

a)Core Courses:(Honours Courses)

Compulsory components of an Academic Programme: These Courses are to be compulsorily studied as a core requirement for the programme.

b)Elective Courses:(Pass Courses)

- Generic Elective (GE) which a student should have to select in his/her 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th Semester from the above table (a student can opt any two subjects or a single subject).
- Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) which a student should select in his/her 5th and 6th Semester. No student can opt the same subject as honours and GE.

c)Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):

The Ability Enhancement Courses shall be of two kinds-

i) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

(A) Communicative English (2 credit) (b) Alternative English/MIL (2 credit), (c) Environmental Science (2 credit).

ii)Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Minimum 4 Credits):

A student has to opt for SEC in 3rd and 4th Semesters. The college CBCS Board will notify the list of subjects provided under this category in due time.



- ♦ A course may also take the form of a Dissertation/Project Work/Practical Training/ Field work/ Seminar etc.
- ♦ A student shall have to study the academic programme as per the scheme of the Programme. Even if a candidate earns the required number of credits before completion of the full duration of the programme, he/she shall not be entitled for the degree.

3. **Course Enrolment:**

The minimum and maximum credits to be opted by a student for qualifying for the graduate degree shall be as per the Course Structure. Change of Course shall not be permitted after sending the records of The students to the University for Registration.

4. **Attendance**

- 80% of attendance during the total number of class days is mandatory.
- A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-Semester Examination.
- A student who has obtained a minimum of 70% of attendance but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the principal and on payment of a Prescribed fee(s) the university will grant exemption to the student.

5. **Examination and Evaluation:**

- a. Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.
- b. There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester examination in each course during every semester.
- c. ***There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of answer- scripts of end- semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.***
- d. Betterment Examination:
 - i. A student shall be entitled to take the '*betterment examination*' in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the sixth Semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for the '*betterment examination*' within one year of passing the Sixth Semester Examination.
 - ii. No '*betterment examination*' shall be allowed in the practical examinations.

6.Results and Progression:

(a) A candidate shall be declared as passed a Course, provided he/ she secures -

i.at least 40% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations.

li. at least 'P' Grade in the 10 point scale combining both the In-semester and End-Semester examination performance.

iii. There shall be no separate pass mark for Internal Assessment.

(b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.

(c) There may be moderation of Internal Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

(d) The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.

(e) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end semester examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses.

(f) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

♦ A student must clear all his/ her Semester Examinations within Six (6) years from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student, viz. First and Second Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in six consecutive chances, Third and Fourth Semester Examinations shall have to be cleared in five consecutive chances and Fifth and Sixth Semester Examinations in four consecutive chances. Under special circumstances, the candidates may avail the fourth chance in Fifth and Sixth Semester Examinations only.

However, after the first chance of the Fifth and Sixth Semester Examinations, the candidate shall be considered as a non-regular candidate.

(g) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

(h) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the Bachelors Degree in the concerned discipline provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately.

(i) The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of the DU-UG CBCSE examinations and issue Grade-sheets.

(j) The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA. However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.



7. Grading System

- The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.
- The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in Terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

- Exclusive Class Interval technique shall be followed in calculation of Grade Point.
- The Letter grade '**B+**' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade '**B**' shall be considered as Second Class.
- A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than '**F**' (Failed) or '**Abs**' (Absent/ Incomplete).
- If a candidate secures '**F**' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.
- If a student secures '**F**' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.
- '**Abs**' grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements:
 - i. If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination.
 - ii. If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination.
 - iii. If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials, practical or field works.
- The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an 'Abs' candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidate shall have to convert the 'Abs' grade by appearing in the next examination on the course concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/assignment etc.

8. Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The UGC recommends the following the procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average(SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average(CGPA)

- The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student i.e. $SGPA (Si) = \frac{\sum(Ci \times Gi)}{\sum Ci}$
Where ' Ci ' is the number of credits of the i th course and ' Gi ' is the grade point scored by the student in the i th Course.
- The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student overall the semester of a programme i.e. $CGPA (Si) = \frac{\sum(Ci \times Si)}{\sum Ci}$
Where ' Si ' is the SGPA of the i th semester and ' Ci ' is the total number of credits in that semester.
- The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

10. Credit Transfer

Inter- Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the Dibrugarh University on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC

11. Rules for Admission on Transfer from other University:

- The University shall allow admission on transfer of students from other Universities. However, such transfer shall be permissible provided that-
 - Both the Universities conduct the same degree programmes under the CBCS.
 - The course structure along with the nomenclature of the courses are similar between the two Universities,
 - The combination of courses opted by the candidate are not changed.
- In fulfillment of the conditions as laid down in clause 11 (a), a candidate may be allowed to get admission on transfer from other Universities on production of transfer certificate, proof of classes attended, migration certificate, etc. not later than 1 (one) month from the commencement of the classes of the semester concerned. The records of class attendance, performance in internal assessment in his/her credit shall be carried over on admission and shall be computed for the purpose of examination. With such permission of transfer, the Credits earned by the student shall also be accepted by the University.
- A candidate shall have to apply for transfer in the prescribed format of the University.

4. Candidates can also take online admission by browsing the link provided in the college website www.ltkcollege.ac.in (Candidates should carefully read the prospectus before or while filling up the Admission and other related Forms)

5. Candidates are required to produce the following documents at the time of admission cum interview.

- a) Original mark sheet of the last qualifying examination.
- b) Original pass certificate from the Board/ Council.
- c) Birth Certificate.
- d) Caste Certificate from the competent authority (for ST/SC/OBC/MOBC/PH candidates.)
- e) Certificate from the Institution last attended for gap period in studies.
- f) Extra-curricular Certificates for Sports and other seats.
- g) Bank Draft of Rs.250/- if 'Admission Form' is downloaded from website.
- h) 2 copies of Passport Size Photos.
- i) Migration Certificate (for Students from other Boards / Universities / Councils)
- j) Students taking 'Free Admission have to produce "Original Annual Income Certificate of their parents as well as each student has to plant a tree within the college campus.

B. Selection procedure

Candidates are selected for admission into H.S and Degree Courses strictly on merit basis subjected to the approval of the 'Admission Committee'. The Admission Committee of the college scrutinizes the 'Admission Forms' and a list of selected candidates is prepared on merit basis and the same list is displayed on the College Notice Board prior to the Interview cum Admission Process.

C. Reservation

Reservation for SC, ST (P), ST (H), OBC, MOBC and Physically Handicapped students are maintained strictly as per the Government of Assam Rules (OBC-15%, SC-7%, ST (P)-10%, ST (H) - 5% and Physically Handicapped-3%). The Merit List is prepared on the basis of the same Reservation System. In addition 5% of total seats is reserved for students having proficiency in sports, NCC, NSS, Scouts and Guides and Cultural activities.

D. Interview cum Admission Scheduled

The dates of interview cum admission into different courses are notified on the college notice board, local dailies and college website immediately after the selection procedure. The selected candidates must have to appear personally before an interview board on date fixed by the admission committee and produce all the original documents, photocopies of which are furnished with the Admission Form.

14. GENERAL RULES

A. Attendance

It is obligatory to attend classes regularly. Willful absence from the classes is treated as a serious breach of college discipline.

HS 1st Year : Students who do not attend minimum of 80% of the total number of classes (both practical and theory classes separately) will not be allowed to sit in the annual examination conducted by AHSEC.

HS 2nd Year : Students who do not attend minimum of 80% of the total number of classes (both practical and theory classes separately) will not be allowed to fill up the forms of HS final year examination conducted by AHSEC.

B.A/B.Sc : Students who do not attend minimum of 80% of the total number of classes in each paper (both practical and theory classes separately) held in any semester will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination conducted by Dibrugarh University.

❖ *Attendance in a particular semester will not be taken in to account in the subsequent semester.*

B. Examination Rules

The examination committee of the college conducts all the examinations and it is obligatory for all the students to appear in all the examinations conducted by the college during an academic session.

The following examinations are conducted by the College during an academic year:

i. Class/College Examinations

- a) **H.S. 1st Year** : Two Unit Tests and Annual Examination
- b) **H.S. 2nd Year** : Two Unit Tests & Terminal Examination

Rules for Internal Assessment in B.A/B.Sc. (Honours) Programmes in Semester System

- c) Students of B.A. and B.Sc. Course will have to appear 2 (two) Sessional Examinations in

each semester.

The marks allotted for internal Assessment is 20% in each course shall be based on the following:

1st Sessional examination (Written) : 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

2nd Sessional examination (Written) : 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

Seminar/Group Discussion : 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

Attendance : 25% of the marks allotted for internal assessment.

If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned.

- ❑ (Result of defaulters on account of College, Hostel, N.C.C., Sports, Students' Union, and Library matters will be kept withheld).
- ❑ Re-admission of unsuccessful students will be governed by "College Admission Rules".
- ❑ Expulsion from any examination will lead to the expulsion from the College.

ii. Annual/Final/End Semester Examinations

- HS 1st Year Examination is conducted by the college authority in accordance to the examination schedule and question papers supplied by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), Guwahati, Assam..
- The H.S final Examination is conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC), Guwahati, Assam.
- All the B.A/B.Sc (End Semester) Examinations are of 80 marks and conducted by Dibrugarh University.

15.COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS

- A.The Societies and Associations of the college shall be subjected to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- B.Only such societies as have been recognized by the principal shall have the facilities of the college premises.
- C.All notices desired to be circulated by the students anywhere in the college premises shall require the approval of the principal.
- D.Class attendance of a student should not be less than 75%.
- E.Filled up registration form of Council/University should be submitted in the office within the stipulated time as fixed by the college authority. No registration form will be received after such time.

The following activities are considered to be major offences against discipline of the college. The students found guilty of committing such offences are liable to face disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion or legal action.

- a) Participation in ragging of any type.
- b) Forcible disruption of classes.
- c) Disobedience and indecent behaviour to fellow students, teachers and college employees.
- d) Damaging, defacing or devaluing college property shall lead to drastic action as deemed fit by the college authority.

16.CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

A. College Uniform

A proper and uniform dress code is compulsory during college hours.

For Boys : White shirt, black trousers (long pants) and black sweater.

For Girls : a) White coloured plain mekhala, white blouse with white chadar with violet colour border line.
b) White coloured Churidar set with violet coloured churni (Du-patta) and black sweater.

(Wearing of college uniform inside the college campus is mandatory, failing which may lead to disciplinary action.)

B. Identity Card

The College Identity Card issued to a student possesses his or her real identity. So it is obligatory for every student to put on his or her identity during the college hours within campus. The Identity Card must be produced as and when demanded by the authority. In case of loss or damage of the Identity Card, students can apply for duplicate Identity Card to the Principal in black and white. Duplicate copy of Identity Card is issued on payment of Rs.50/- with an application.

- ❖ To procure the Identity Card of the college a separate duly filled up form should be submitted along with the admission form with 2 (two) copies of Stamp Size photos.

(Any violation of the Code of Conduct will invite strict disciplinary action extending upto expulsion from the College.)

17.OTHERS

A. Hostels Facilities and hostel rules

The college offers hostel accommodation for both boys and girls. Both the hostels are situated within the college campus in a healthy and secured environment. Conduct in the hostel is governed by the 'L.T.K. College Hostel Rules' copies of which are available in the College Office free of charge. Hostels remain closed during summer, winter and Puja Vacations.

- All boarders are to maintain strict discipline as per the Hostel rules. Violation will invite punitive action even to the extent of expulsion from the hostel and the College.
